ACADEMICS

NUMBERS & PRE NUMBERS

Numbers 1 to 3 were introduced to the Pre Nursery students with the help of finger counting, object counting and Montessori method of Spindle box and Cards and Counters. A Special game, Hopscotch (Stapoo) was also organized to make number learning fun.

Pre Numbers

We take small steps with Pre Nursery children. Pre Number concepts are introduced to them before we move to big numbers and operations using them. Children were taught, using activities, to identify big & small, fat & thin and More & Less. Special activity Feed the BIG monster was organised to make the concept interesting. Through 'Pink tower' activity in the Montessori the concept was reinforced. Children enjoyed doing some related worksheets to make the concepts clear.



COLOUR CONCEPT

Aadyant school ,introducing colours to young ones has always been important. Each and every colour is celebrated in school because every colour has a significance. In July colour Blue was introduced and celebrated. Children did balloon dabbing activity during the introduction .Blue Day was celebrated and blue paper pots were made on which magic painting was done. Children carried it home as a Blue Day craft. Staff and students wore Blue coloured clothes and school was decorated with blue objects and cut out. In August colour we celebrated Green colour. Children did sponge dabbing on white chart paper to make 'frog on green pods'. Green Day was celebrated in school with a special assembly . Staff and Children wore green coloured clothes to make the day special. Orange was the colour of September. Children did sponge dabbing on big huge carrot with orange paint. Orange Day was celebrated in school and kids took home an Orange as Orange Day craft. Staff and children wore orange colour clothes on orange day and school was decorated with Orange cut outs and objects. Children enjoyed interesting activities related to the colours each month, making it easy for every child to recognise the colours.



COMPUTERS

Technology is becoming an integral part of our day to day learning. So, at Aadyant we try to imbibe children with technical learning at a very early stage. Pre Nursery children were introduced to the various parts of the computer. They are learning to click and drag, draw lines and fill colours in different shapes. Through this technique children will develop sensory and motor coordination skills in a creative way.

BIRDS & INSECTS

Birds and insects are fascinating creatures that live all around us. It is an interesting topic for all age groups. Children were excited to learn about their feathered friends and crawlies and creepees. They were explained about the physical features of the birds and insects. Hatching of an egg and Life-cycle of a butterfly was learnt by Nursery class. Fun-filled activities helped the students understand the significance of birds and insects in nature. Duck sailing activity was done by play group children. For better understanding of our Feathered Friends matching of birds with their feathers were done by Pre Nursery classes. Children showed their enthusiasm in "Show and tell" activity on Birds and insects. Different games like treasure hunt was enjoyed by all the levels. Hands on activities gave the young learners a deep insight of topic.

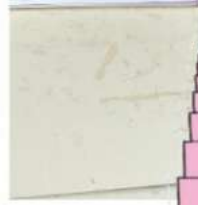


MONTESSORI



Hands on tasks are some of the most essential activities within a Montessori class. These activities allow students to use their hands to discover the world around them, keeping them captivated and focused on the subject at hand.

This quarter the Pre-nursery children were introduced to the various Montessori activities like ;Pink tower, Colour box 1, Spindle box 1, pegging, screwing and unscrewing of bottle caps. Wet and Dry pouring activities help children to develop fine motor skills at an early age. These activities provide valuable sensory experience ,which are vital for a child's development. The pink tower helps a child develop visual discrimination and introduces them to mathematical concepts of big and small. Also helps them develop fine motor skills. The Colour box 1 helps children identify colours,;earning their names, learning to match colours and develop fine motor skills. Spindle box 1 helps a child to develop early counting skills and learn to associate between quantity and the numbered symbols {0- 9}. The wooden box has ten compartments into which the child counts and places the wooden spindles corresponding to their number.
