Each child came with his cart ,collected some vegetables and went towards the counter to purchase them with the dummy currency .

It was a funday for the kids with so much to tell their parents about it. This activity made them feel independent and also enhanced their social skills and recognitive skills.





## FRUITS

"Don't judge a tree by its size, but by its fruit". Fruits are liked by many mainly for its colourful appeal and natural sweetness. They supply essential nutrients, minerals, vitamins and antioxidants, which are important for human health and well being. Fruits are an essential topic for children of all age groups. The children were enthusiastic to learn about different varieties of fruits. They were encouraged touch the fruit, feel its texture and also smell the different types of fruit. They were also motivated to name the colours of the fruits they saw, the fruits were cut in front of them to let them observe what the inside looks like. The playgroup took part in juice making activity by squeezing oranges to improve fine motor skills. The children were asked to bring Bananas to school, peel them and put the peel in the dustbin to teach civic values. They were also asked to wear yellow clothes to help comprehend the topic. A fun activity was conducted in class to further enrich their experience with the topic at hand, the children were taught how to make fruit cream. To develop the cognitive and gross motor skills, Pre Nursery played a game of "Musical Chair of Fruits" and added a new twist to the age old game to make it playful and interesting for the children.

They also understood the value of money as they had to limit their purchases and could not buy everything they wanted to, giving them the understanding of the limitations we face with our purchasing power. They also got the confidence to deal with strangers, all by them selves, as just going to the cash counter and asking the cashier to do the billing was also a big activity for these small children. Overall it was a fun experience which they enjoyed immensely.

#### NURSERY

Also, 'Alphabet Game' to reinforce phonetic sounds and 'Planting a Sapling' to provide students with environmentally conscious learning experience was planned.

### GRADE 1

Maths: Solving Math problems through collaboration- Children were divided into groups of three and were told to come up with an addition or subtraction problem and then solve it by brainstorming together! Children also enjoyed collecting fallen leaves and twigs for 'Number in Nature' activity. Using it later to count and add to enhance their mathematical skills.

<u>Hindi-</u> Story-telling was done by the teacher to create awareness about life values such as sharing, caring and cooperation. Also, learning the art of happiness!

**EVS**- For EVS 'Let's tie our shoe laces activity' was conducted to make children self-reliant.


