ACADEMICS



In the lively prenursery music class, tiny fingers eagerly explore colorful instruments, creating a symphony of giggles and joyful melodies. Together, children sway to the rhythm, discovering the magic of music through playful activities that spark their curiosity and nurture a love for harmonious sounds. Various instruments such as the congo, bongo, and piano are incorporated, along with a few other musical instruments.













CLAY MOULDING

Clay moulding is a great activity that helps children in many ways. It works on the fundamental aspects of play-based learning. Kids love it and it helps them develop important life skills such as problem-solving, planning, exploring, evaluating, and constructing shapes. Clay modeling in small groups allows for fun, communication, sharing, and also improves social skills. This activity nurtures a child's creativity, selfconfidence, and boosts their imagination. At Aadyant, clay modeling is an important part of our curriculum. Children learn to mould different objects on the potter's wheel as well as through free play and using stampers. Playing with clay has a calming effect on children and is a great way to allow young children to physically express their emotions. It also promotes sensory development. While working with the clay, kids learn to concentrate. The activity builds self-esteem and helps children acquire a sense of competency, power, and control over their environment.

NUMBERS

A world of numbers and beyond...Numbers are introduced to the children of playgroup and pre Nursery in a fun and engaging way to foster a positive relationship with mathematics from an early age. We start with pre number concepts moving on to concrete objects like counting toys in the class counting the number of children present ,the number of chairs, the number of tables etc. This way they can relate and use the numbers in their daily life. We use songs and rhymes that involve counting and number recognition. Songs like 5 Little Monkeys Jumping On The Bed, 12345 Once I caught a fish alive, not only introduce numbers but also help the kids with counting skills and rhythm. Further, we use visual aids such as number flash cards posters or books with colourful illustrations. Visual representations help children associate the written numeral with its quantity and reinforce their understanding. As they move on to primary different teaching aids are used like foam blocks which are used to teach addition and subtraction, ganit mala and colourful blocks so that children learn and practice in a play way method.









































The very foundation of reading starts with the cvc words taught to the kids at their early learning years. CVC meaning consonant vowel Consonant words. The kg class had their playful activity related to the cvc words where the they had to form the cvc words with the help of the alphabet. A group of picture flash cards were kept in front of the child and he or she had to form the cvc words with the help of the alphabets given example bat, cat, mat, nip, top etc. This fun activity gave the teacher a insight on how well the kids had understood the concept and the children also enjoyed the same.

MONTESSORI-MATHS

Mathematics is an integral part of every individual's life. The Montessori mathematics provides children with the opportunity to build a firm foundation for the forthcoming abstract and complex mathematical concepts. There are some basic examples of Montessori mathematics activities for pre schoolers. These are Number Rods, Sandpaper Numerals and Spindle Box. Number rods are the ones which introduce the concepts of numbers and counting to children. And with the help of Spindle box and Sandpaper Numerals children can easily recognize the numerals and discriminate between different numbers. Similarly, Sandpaper Letters and Flash Cards are the another way to introduce the letters in Montessori classroom. The teacher may have a large tray with sandpaper letters covered in sand, rice or salt so children can dig through the bin, find the letters and identify the sounds.





SPORTS

Playing sports on daily basis help in developing the mental skills. It enhances the overall personality of an individual by making students fit and active. Aadyant sports classes are given for all levels, from playgroup to primary classes. Whereas in playgroup and pre - nursery, children play with cones and hula hoops, playing games keep them physically and mentally engaged. On the other hand, nursery upwards children enjoy playing with hurdles and football and are eager to learn new tactics that will help them gain confidence and skills.

SCHOOL PICNIC


