ACADEMICS (PG & PN)

CAR WASH ACTIVITY



The Play Group class participated in a fun car wash activity where the children enthusiastically washed toy cars. Using scrubbers, they carefully cleaned the cars, enjoying the process of scrubbing and splashing water. This activity not only brought smiles to their faces but also helped them develop their motor skills and learn about cleanliness in a playful way. Such activities encourage teamwork and build a sense of responsibility in young children while keeping them engaged and entertained.



ORANGE PEELING ACTIVITY



We conducted a fun and engaging Orange Peeling Activity for the little ones! The activity was a wonderful opportunity to enhance their fine motor skills, hand-eye coordination, and sensory exploration. The children thoroughly enjoyed peeling their oranges with gentle guidance, exploring the textures, and learning about this nutritious fruit. It was a joyful experience that also encouraged healthy eating habits.

PEGGING ACTIVITY



Montessori pegging is a hands - on, self-directed activity designed for young children, typically between the ages of 2-6 years. The primary purpose of Montessori pegging is to help children develop their fine motor skills, hand-eye coordination and dexterity. Our pre nursery children practiced their fine motor skills by placing colourful pegs carefully onto a basket and they start to work independently, making choices about which pegs to use and where to place them.



ORGANIC FARMING

Organic farming is a method of agricultural production that excludes the use of synthetic substances, such as pesticides, synthetic medicines or fertilisers, and genetically modified organisms. It reduces the risks of humans, animals and environmental exposure to toxic materials. It reduces the soil erosion. It enriches the soil with microbial growth. Children were introduced to the organic farming in school by sowing seeds and watering the plants. Later they were told about the produce. Organic farming activities encourage outdoor play and physical activity. Children can develop confidence by integrating farming into their lifestyle. Involvement in organic farming activities encourages physical activity and outdoor play, promoting overall health and well-being.

PINK DAY CELEBRATION

HEALTHY & UNHEALTHY FOOD

This hands on fun activity is a fun way to help kids learn about foods.

Children were introduced to healthy and unhealthy food.

WINTER SEASON



Winter is one of the most important seasons in India. It is a part of the four seasons that occur in India. Winters are the coolest season that starts from December and last till March. The peak time when winter is experienced the most in December and January. Children engaged in various activities to deepen their understanding of this chilly time of the year. They learned about the food commonly enjoyed during winter, the types of clothing that keep us warm, and the precautions to stay healthy. Adding a creative touch, they also made beautiful winter-themed crafts, showcasing their enthusiasm and creativity.

ACADEMICS (PRE-PRIMARY & PRIMARY)

SEED GERMINATION (NURSERY)

Our seed germination experiment allows kids to see up close to how a seed grows! Learn about the steps of seed germination, and investigate what conditions a seed needs to germinate. Students made clay pots and germinated black eyed peas (lobia seeds) in it and it was indeed a great learning experience for them.



VOWELS MATCHING (KG)

The aim of this activity was to make children:

- Recognize and identify the different vowel letters (A, E, I, O, U) and their sounds.
- Develop phonemic awareness by matching vowels to their corresponding sounds or pictures.
- Improve literacy skills through interactive and engaging vowel recognition practice.

SHABD BANAO (Grade 1)

Students have to use their thinking ability and create new words using letters

Objectives of this activity:

1. Develop vocabulary skills.
2. Enhance word recognition.
3. Improve spelling abilities.
4. Encourage creative thinking.



PREPOSITIONS THROUGH PREPOSITION MOVEMENT (Grade 2)

Children were told to enact out prepositions. Such activities help children learn in a memorable way.

PATTERNS (Grade 3)



Patterns are a fundamental concept in mathematics, used in nature, art, and everyday life.

Recognizing and understanding patterns helps develop critical thinking, problem-solving skills. Branching trees, flower petals, honeycombs are examples of pattern. Everyday Life: 1. Time management: Scheduling and routine patterns. 2. Music and art: Patterns in rhythm, melody, and composition. 3. Language: Patterns in grammar, syntax, and vocabulary. 4. Travel: Patterns in traffic flow, navigation, and route optimization. 5. Health and fitness: Patterns in exercise routines and nutrition planning.



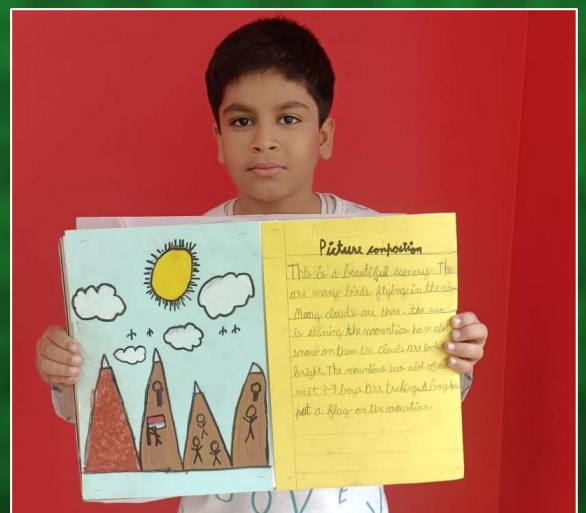
STATES AND CAPITALS OF INDIA (Grade 3)

In this activity, class-3 explore the states and capitals of India using a political map. India is a vast country divided into 28 states and 8 Union territories, each with its own unique culture, language, and traditions.
