ACADEMICS (PG & PN)



MATCH THE FRUITS

“An Apple A Day Keeps The Doctor Away”.

Our little ones enjoyed playing a game fun filled with fruits and balls .

Children were given a basket full of fruit balls of three different colours orange, red and yellow and 3 baskets were presented with labels of Apple, Orange and Mango .

Children were asked to match the fruits and put the balls inside the appropriate basket.



JOY OF HARVESTING

The joy of harvesting is the profound satisfaction of reaping what you have sown, transforming months of patience, care, and labor into tangible, homegrown bounty. It is a moment of deep connection to nature, where the simple act of gathering fresh, organic food brings a sense of accomplishment, gratitude, and pure, heartfelt happiness. Excitement filled the air as the children of Baby Blossoms pulled fresh turnips from the soil. These turnips were then handed over to the school chef, who prepared a delicious Turnip soup. When served, the children savored every sip, feeling a sense of accomplishment and joy in enjoying the fruits of their efforts. This hands-on experience not only taught them about farming but also highlighted the value of sustainable living and the satisfaction of consuming fresh homegrown produce.



REINFORCEMENT OF NUMBERS

An activity on recognition of numbers was conducted by Rising Stars using a phone number dialing concept. Students were shown numbers and asked to recognize them. They then practiced number dialing on phone chart. This activity helped students identify numbers, improve number recognition, and understand the correct sequence of numbers. The hands-on activity made learning enjoyable and enhanced students' interest and confidence.

LETTER SOUNDS

Importance of Letter Sounds
Learning letter sounds is an important step in early literacy. It helps children understand that each letter makes a specific sound, which is the foundation for reading and writing. When children know letter sounds, they can begin to blend sounds to form words, improve pronunciation, and recognize words more easily. Letter sounds also support spelling skills and boost children's confidence in communication. Early exposure to letter sounds makes reading fun, meaningful, and easier as children grow. To build their vocabulary Hilly Billies class played a fun game with sounds where they had to feed the granny with the pictures of the objects starting with one particular sound.

SHOW & TELL (COMMUNITY HELPERS)

The little stars of Star Hunter Class beautifully presented a “Show and Tell” activity in Fancy Dress on the theme “Community Helpers.” Dressed as doctors, policemen, firefighters, teachers, chefs, soldiers and many other helpers, our tiny tots looked confident and adorable on stage. With bright smiles and great enthusiasm, the children spoke a few lines about their chosen community helpers, expressing how they help us in our daily lives. This activity helped develop their confidence, speaking skills, stage presence, and awareness of the world around them.

REVISION OF COLOURS

Today children of Feather Faces did Revision of colours that introduces young children to basic colors such as red, blue, yellow, green, and orange. Children learn to observe, compare, and match objects or pictures that have the same color. This activity improves color recognition, visual discrimination, attention, and early thinking skills. It also helps develop hand-eye coordination when children match cards, blocks, or everyday objects. Through games and classroom activities, children become more confident in identifying colors and begin to understand similarities and differences. The activity makes learning enjoyable while supporting early cognitive and language development.

LEARNING ABOUT FLOWERS

The Rainbow Rompers class participated in a fun and engaging activity focused on flowers. During this activity, the children explored different types of flowers such as roses and marigolds. They were given flower puzzle pieces and worked on assembling them to form complete flowers. By matching the cut-out pieces correctly, the children learned to recognize that the puzzles came together to create a rose or other flowers. Through this hands-on experience, the children not only enjoyed the activity but also developed a better understanding of flowers. The activity helped them connect with nature, stimulated their sense of touch, and encouraged learning through exploration. It was a joyful and enriching experience for everyone.

NUMBER MATCHING (Nursery)

The children of Nursery class dived into the fun-filled world of numbers with the exciting Number Object Matching Activity! With giggles and curiosity, they matched objects with the right numbers, effortlessly grasping counting concepts through this interactive and enjoyable exercise. This hands-on approach not only made learning fun but also helped develop their problem-solving skills and understanding of numbers.



ACADEMICS (PRE-PRIMARY & PRIMARY)

WORD MATCH (K.G)

In this fun and interactive Word Family Activity, our little learners picked up ice-cream sticks with CVC words written on them and carefully placed them into the correct word family cups like -op, -an, -ag, -at, -ap.

This hands-on activity helped them:

Recognize rhyming patterns,
Strengthen phonics skills,
Improve reading fluency.
Build vocabulary in a playful way,
enhance fine motor skills and
concentration .



COUNTING HANDS (K.G)

In this engaging addition activity, our young learners first wrote the numbers in the boxes and then used the fingers of the hands pasted beside them to count and find the total. Watching them carefully count each finger and confidently write the final answer was truly a proud classroom moment.

This hands-on approach strengthens number recognition, builds a clear understanding of addition, and develops focus and fine motor skills — all while keeping learning joyful and interactive. Because when children can see and touch math, they truly understand it.



ACADEMICS (PRE-PRIMARY & PRIMARY)



MONEY (Grade 1)

Students enjoyed a joyful and meaningful learning experience through a market role-play activity. The children confidently stepped into the roles of shopkeepers and buyers, using play currency notes to buy and sell everyday items. Through this hands on activity, students practiced counting, recognizing numbers, understanding money value and simple transactions. Learning came alive as maths was connected to real-life situations, making the experience engaging, interactive and full of excitement.



WHO, WHERE & WHAT (Grade 1)

Students used colourful flash cards to complete sentences by choosing the right who, what and where. A simple activity that encouraged thinking, reading, and confidence, while making language learning joyful and hands-on.

POLLUTION (Grade 2)

Our young learners are learning about pollution and how to protect our Earth. They shared simple ideas about air, water, and soil pollution and discussed ways to keep the environment clean, such as planting trees, using dustbins, saving water, and avoiding plastic. Through this learning, children are becoming aware of their responsibility towards nature and developing good habits for a cleaner and healthier future.



PARTS OF PLANE SHAPES (Grade 2)

The parts of plane shapes are essential concepts in geometry, helping us understand and describe the properties and characteristics of various shapes.

Knowing these parts enables us to:

1. **Identify shapes:** Recognize and name shapes, such as triangles, quadrilaterals, polygons, circles, etc.
- Key parts of plane shapes include:
2. **Sides:** Line segments forming the shape's boundary.
3. **Vertices:** Points where sides meet.

Understanding these parts helps build a strong foundation in geometry.



REINFORCEMENT OF HOMOPHONES (Grade 3)

Grade 3 did Reinforcement of Homophones through an activity.

Each child was given a worksheet with incomplete sentences and a separate sheet with homophone pairs.

They were to cut the correct word and fill in the blanks with the suitable homophones.

ACADEMICS (PRE-PRIMARY & PRIMARY)

AREA & PERIMETER (Grade 4)

A geoboard is a board with small pegs. Students use rubber bands to make different shapes. Perimeter means the boundary or the distance around a shape. Children stretch a rubber band around pegs to form a shape.

They count the sides or units around the shape. This makes them clearly see what “around” means. Instead of just memorizing a formula, they see and count the boundary. Area means the space inside a shape. Students form a shape. They count the small squares inside the shape.

They understand that area is the “space covered.” It becomes easy to understand because they can visually see the space inside. It makes maths fun and interesting. Improves visual understanding.

Encourages hands-on learning.



कारक (Grade 5)

कक्षा 5 के विद्यार्थियों ने कारक पर एक रोचक गतिविधि की। इस गतिविधि में मेज़ पर कुछ कारक के भेदों के उदाहरण वाक्य में लिखकर रखे गए थे। बोर्ड पर विषय - कारक चिपकाया हुआ था तथा कारक के भेदों के नाम व उसकी परिभाषा के साथ लिखकर एक चार्ट पर चिपकाया और उस चार्ट को बोर्ड पर लगाया गया था। बच्चों को मेज़ से एक कारक भेदों के उदाहरण को चुनना था और उसे पढ़कर उपयुक्त कारक भेदों के नीचे चिपकाना था। इस गतिविधि के माध्यम से बच्चों ने कारक के भेदों की पहचान की तथा उसके उदाहरण का उचित प्रयोग करना सीखा। बच्चों ने अपने सोचने की क्षमता और पहचानने की शक्ति का विकास किया। इस क्रिया से सभी बच्चों के ज्ञान में बढ़ोतरी हुई और आत्मविश्वास भी बढ़ा।

REPUBLIC DAY CELEBRATION

Our school celebrated Republic Day with great pride and enthusiasm. The day began with a special assembly where children were introduced to the importance of Republic Day in a simple and meaningful way.
